Rigging and De-rigging Guidelines for Melges 24 on the Water

Rigging:

- 1. Hatches closed inside the boat on the starboard side.
- 2. Bailing the boat.
- 3. Adjust forestay tension and ensure it is in the base position.
- More can be found in the document "How to set the Melges in base." on our "Documents" page.
- 4. Unroll and prepare the mainsail, storing the sail bag in a dry place.
- 5. Release the boom vang and mainsheet.
 - Pump the vang if necessary.
- 6. Attach the mainsail to the boom.
- 7. Secure the mainsail halyard and tension it.
- 8. Attach the fine-tune for the mainsail halyard.
- 9. Attach the cunningham.
- 10. Place the spinnaker bag in the hatch.
- 11. Thread the spinnaker sheets and secure them, along with the tack and halyard.
- 12. All mooring lines on the dock, NOT IN THE WATER.
- 13. Sail and enjoy.

De-rigging:

- 1. Secure the boat in the middle of the slip using 4 tie-down points.
- 2. Roll the mainsail without folding it.
- 3. Put on the mainsail cover.
- 4. Pack away the spinnaker.
 - Dry spinnaker:
 - Take the spinnaker in the bag before removing the lines.
 - Wet spinnaker:
 - Hang it up and take it down the next day.
- 5. Gather and tighten the spinnaker sheets.
- 6. Secure the spinnaker halyard and tack on the rail.
- 7. Lower the mainsail halyard on the boom. Hoist the boom and secure it to the railing.
 - It's wise to secure it on the opposite side of where you step on.
- 8. Tension the mainsheet, coil it up, and secure it to the boom.
- 9. Wrap the backstay around the rudder.
- 10. Gently release the forestay tension.
- 11. Set it to base.
- 12. Bailing the boat.
- 13. Close the hatches.
- 14. Rinse the boat, hull, deck, and cockpit.
